MARCH'S CLASSROOM FOCUS

Our 8th grade students will be finishing their argument writing this month. They will be working hard on the editing and revision process to better understand that writing is a process that requires much effort in order to improve. We are providing students with strategies and rubrics to assist them as they reflect on their own writing.

During the week of March 13, our students

will participate in the Reading Inventory assessment that measures the quantitative reading abilities of each student. This assessment is computer based and takes approximately 30 minutes to complete. The data from this assessment will help schools determine which students may need further support in reading comprehension next year and will be a factor when scheduling student classes for the

2017-18 school year.

Teachers will take some time this month to introduce students to the new format of the MCAS which requires all students to write text-based narratives and essays. Eighth graders will be taking this assessment on-line, so teachers will also devote some time to introducing students to the digital tools that will assist them in this task.
